I do not know!

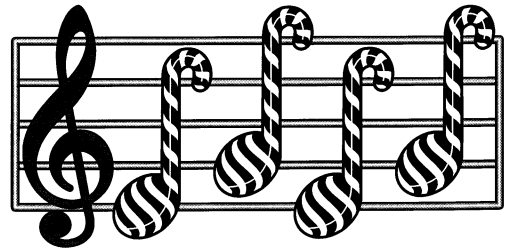

To make them wash their hands.

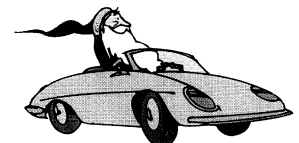
Pulling out slivers, and asthma too,

Chr's is on a red-eye flight.

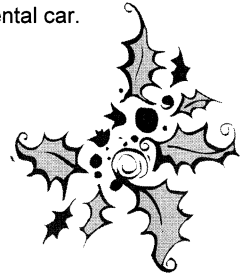
The airline sent his luggage away,
